Dear Parents and Carers,



#### **UNFORM**

I wrote on Dojo this week about uniform issues. Please make sure that from Monday pupils are wearing only the correct uniform. This means – knee length 'school skirts' for girls, trousers, polo shirt or formal shirt WITH TIE. Girls may wear a blue checked gingham dress if they wish to and shorts may be worn as long as these are trouser material and not sports shorts. Please make sure that pupils are wearing the appropriate footwear. Trainers must not be worn except for PE and open toed sandals are also not allowed for safety reasons. Shoes should be 'Clarks' style shoes. Please make sure that if your child needs new shoes over the holidays that you don't buy black trainers – despite the children trying to convince you that these are ok – they are not. Trainers should only be worn during outdoor PE. Please ensure that your child's name is in all clothing.

On this same topic, can I also remind parents that hairstyles should be appropriate for school. Coloured hair of any kind is not allowed and any styles should be safe – no beads (which can be caught on things) or overly large head bands, tram lines and intricate designs are not allowed either.

If your child wants their ears pierced, please do this at the very start of the 6 weeks' holiday so that they can take part in PE lessons in September.

Please note that we will be moving back to plain white PE T-shirts in September.

#### **PARKING**



I have had complaints from local residents again about inconsiderate parking. Can I please remind everyone that you should not block people's driveways or park in dangerous places whilst dropping off and collecting pupils.
